The NSF GRACE Project is recruiting **middle and high school teachers** in Michigan to participate in a 60-hour PD for bringing GIS (Geographical Information System) instructional tools and educational experiences into classrooms. Teachers completing the program will receive a stipend of \$1,100. SCECH credits are available as well.

The GRACE Project is also recruiting **high school students** to participate in summer, 2017, in the GIS (Geographical Information System) Internship Program. This is a paid internship within a student's own community. Students will prepare for the internship by completing a series of ESRI virtual campus courses (equaling ~46 hours). Software and installation support are free.
